In his statement shared online Friday, Caleb explained that he had spent years wrestling internally with his identity. The Beartooth vocalist described the process as confusing, emotional, and deeply personal, saying he had finally reached a point where he could live honestly and openly.

Over the past few months, fans had already started speculating after Beartooth released the video for “Free,” a track that many now see as a giant emotional breadcrumb trail leading to this moment. Caleb appeared dramatically different in the video — physically, stylistically, even emotionally. The intense makeover, paired with lyrics about freedom and authenticity, sparked endless online theories.

Some fans celebrated the visible transformation. Others... not so much.

Social media turned ugly pretty quickly, especially in certain corners of the heavy music community where change tends to trigger knee-jerk reactions. Caleb eventually disappeared from his personal social accounts for several months amid the noise before quietly returning in May.
